## How to Apply

You can apply to study at JCU Brisbane either through an education agent or directly with the University. We have several in-country managers to assist you with any questions you may have. Whichever method you choose, your application must be accompanied by supporting documents so we can review your eligibility.

Note: Not all applicants are eligible to apply directly with the university and are required to apply through one of our JCU Brisbane registered education agents. A current list of our registered agents can be found on our website:

Make certain you allow sufficient time for all of the following steps to be completed to ensure you have time to attend registration and orientation before classes start. If your application has arrived too late for you to commence study in your preferred trimester, your application will be assessed for entry into the next intake.

#### Step 1

Select your preferred course, major and intake date (take note of duration and cost). Check the Entry Requirements to see if you are eligible and qualify.

#### Step 2

Submit a fully completed application form. Please make sure to use your full legal name as it appears on your passport.

Submit your academic transcripts and certificates from your senior school studies and any further studies you have undertaken, evidence of English language proficiency and a copy of your passport to JCU Brisbane Admissions or your education agent.

If documentation is in a language other than English, an official English translation must be included (translated by the awarding institution or an official translating service). Your academic transcripts must be accompanied by the grading scale used at the institution/s where you have undertaken your studies.

Please be aware that while scanned copies of certificates and transcripts can be used during the assessment process, direct applicants are required to send original certified copies of supporting documents to JCU Brisbane by courier or post, prior to accepting a Letter of Offer.

#### Step 3

Your application will be assessed based on the academic and English language entry requirements for your preferred degree as well as genuine temporary entrant requirements.

#### Step 4

If your application is successful, a Letter of Offer will be emailed to you or your education agent. The Letter of Offer includes:

- Name and duration of the degree into which you have been accepted
- Any Advanced Standing you have been awarded for previous study
- Tuition fees and other costs
- · Terms and conditions of enrolment

### Step 5

To accept your offer, you need to:

- Read the entire offer letter carefully
- Meet any enrolment conditions stated in the offer letter
- Sign every page of the offer letter acknowledging you have read and understood the information on each page; complete, sign and date the Terms of Agreement declaration and the Acceptance and Payment Agreement
- Make the required advance deposit
- Return the completed and signed offer letter to JCU Brisbane Admissions or your education agent

#### Step 6

An electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) will be issued to you or your education agent. This is the document that you require to apply for an Australian student visa.

#### Step 7

Use your eCoE to obtain a student visa from your nearest Embassy or Consulate.

Note: Visa applications can take up to three months or more to process depending on your citizenship and the country from which you are applying.

#### Step 8

Once you have a student visa, you are ready to begin your study.
