Estimated costs

The following estimates reflect a typical amount you could expect to pay for your first year of a direct-entry undergraduate degree program if you enrol in a full course load (the maximum number of courses allowed—e.g. 30 credit units for Arts and Science students) in the fall and winter terms (September–April).

International student tuition	\$37,878-\$60,823
Student fees	\$1,308.24
USask Residence rental rates	\$5,304-\$12,496
Textbooks and supplies	\$1,500-\$2,500
Total estimate per year	\$45,990-\$77,127

2025-2026 tuition rates for a typical student course offering within each program are represented. Tuition rates are subject to increase on an annual basis. New rates for the upcoming academic year are typically released in April.

Full-time, on-campus student fees estimate for the 2025-2026 fall and winter terms (September–April) is represented.

Residence rental rates are assessed per person depending on accommodation type, and include all utilities (electricity, water and heating), managed Wi-Fi and laundry. Rates are subject to increase on an annual basis.
