

The University of Calgary, located in the heart of Southern Alberta, both acknowledges and pays tribute to the traditional territories of the peoples of Treaty 7, which include the Blackfoot Confederacy (comprised of the Siksika, the Piikani, and the Kainai First Nations), the Tsuut'ina First Nation, and the Stoney Nakoda (including Chiniki, Bearspaw, and Goodstoney First Nations). The City of Calgary is also home to the Métis Nation of Alberta (Districts 5 and 6).

The University of Calgary is situated on land Northwest of where the Bow River meets the Elbow River, a site traditionally known as Moh'kins'tsis to the Blackfoot, Wîchîspa to the Stoney Nakoda, and Guts'ists'i to the Tsuut'ina. MEET LUIZ

An inspired entrepreneur

Luiz, an international student from Brazil, chose UCalgary to study electrical engineering. Driven by a passion for efficiency and innovation, Luiz sought to revolutionize the beef industry through technology, inspired by lean manufacturing and his friend Diogo's farming experience.



Luiz and Diogo co-founded Munitora alongside Ana and David, software engineering students at UCalgary, to enhance farming efficiency with business-intelligence software, providing farmers with digital tools for better management and data-driven decisions.



Munitora's mobile app interfaces with RFID tags on cattle, enabling farmers to collect and analyze data on each animal, transforming traditional methods into a digital system.



Supported through the Launchpad program at the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking, Luiz and his co-founders received mentorship and resources to develop Munitora, growing it from an idea to a functioning enterprise.



UCalgary's entrepreneurial ecosystem was crucial to Munitora's success. Luiz and his co-founders' participation in the Launchpad program, coupled with their victories in the Liftoff and TCC Energy Pitch competitions, secured \$50,000 in funding. Munitora is now ready to launch its MVP (minimum viable product), set to impact the farming industry significantly.





As Canada's youngest top research university, we offer opportunities to take part in groundbreaking projects — from water sustainability with local communities to tracking space data with NASA.

Through the UCalgary Program for Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) award, Abdu studied the differences between men and women with ALS (a disease that affects nerve cells and muscles) by looking at how genes are expressed. His research project, RNASeq profiling of PBMC from ALS patients, focused on understanding the causes of ALS and how it impacts the body. He's passionate about studying brain and nerve diseases and was excited to explore research and real-life treatments in neuroscience.



With more than half a billion dollars in research funding, UCalgary is creating real solutions. We've launched more than 90 startups in the past five years — more than any other Canadian university.

Once you complete Grade 12 (senior-level) courses, including predicted grades for year-long classes, those will be used.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

There are three ways to meet our English language entrance requirements:

1. High school studies

Three years of study in an ELPexempt country, or at an accredited high school (Canadian, American, British or CIS school) where English is the primary language of instruction. Your final English course must also be equivalent to Alberta's senior level (Grade 12) English.

2. English language test scores

Present the minimum required score from an accepted test:
