PRE-ASSESSMENT

Students from **Bangladesh, Ghana, India, Iran and Nigeria** must start with our free of charge, pre-assessment application process: tru.ca/ipreapply.

3

APPLY

Apply online at truworld.ca/apply. Apply as per instructions provided upon being pre-assessed. A non-refundable application fee of CDN 100.00 will be required to complete your application.

4

PAPERWORK

Upload all required documents and transcripts.

5

ACCEPTANCE

If you are successful, you will receive a conditional acceptance letter. This process normally takes one week.

6

COMMITMENT

Make your full commitment fee payment and arrange to have your official transcripts couriered or emailed by your institution to International Admissions.

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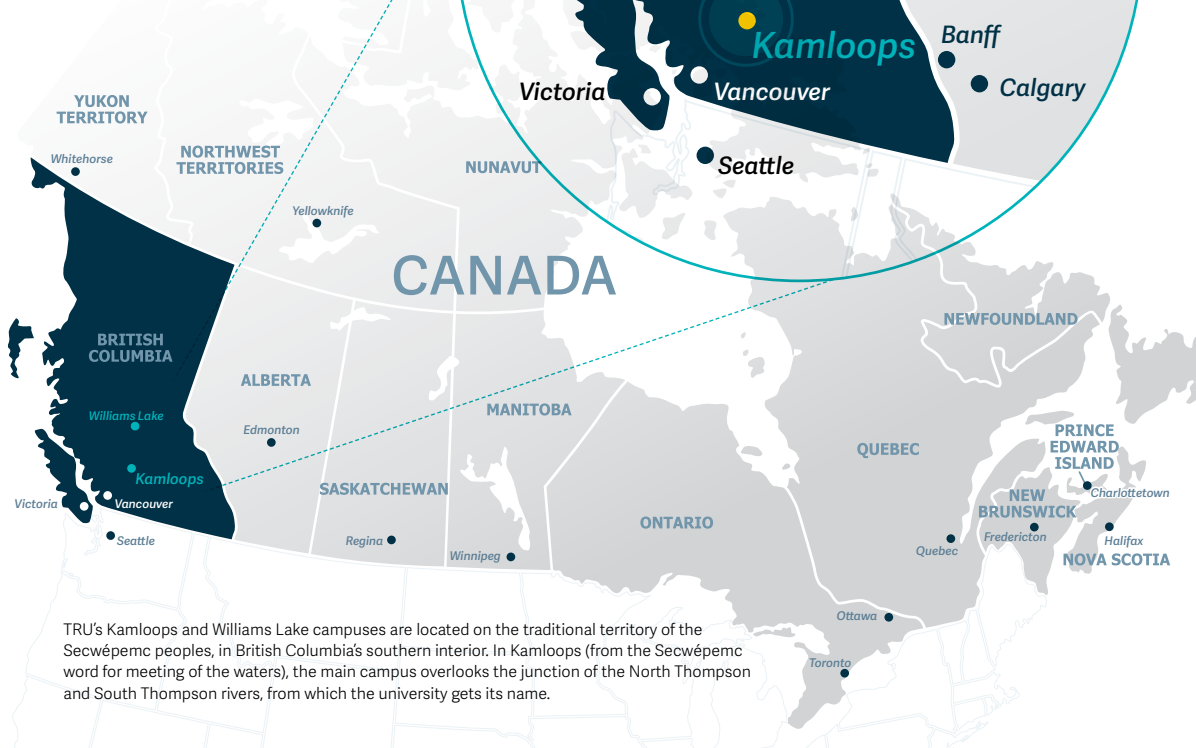

TRU's Kamloops and Williams Lake campuses are located on the traditional territory of the Secwépemc peoples, in British Columbia's southern interior. In Kamloops (from the Secwépemc word for meeting of the waters), the main campus overlooks the junction of the North Thompson and South Thompson rivers, from which the university gets its name.
