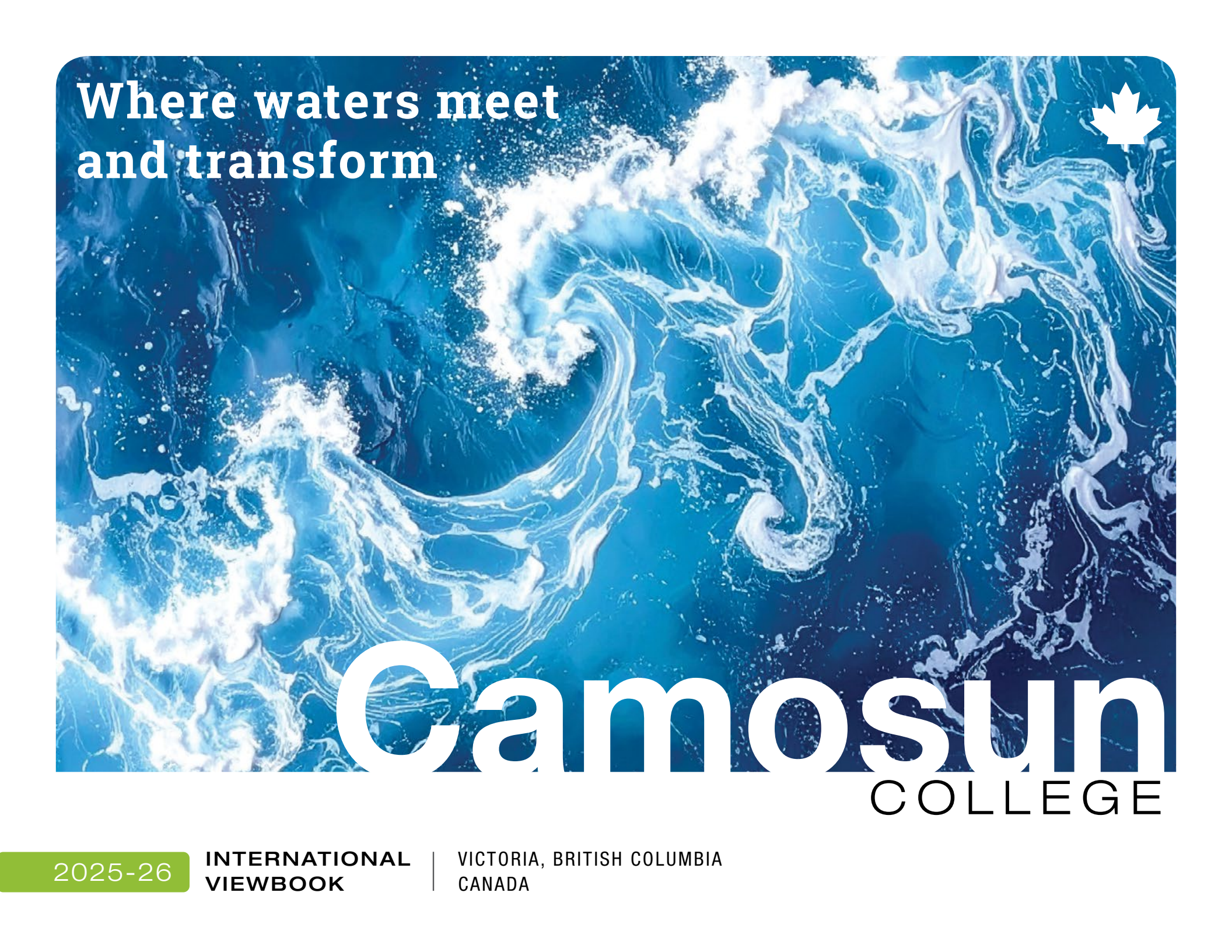

Victoria has the **mildest climate in Canada**. Enjoy outdoor activities year round.

Big enough for internships and jobs across **tech, tourism, education, marine, engineering, and sport and exercise industries**. Small enough that you won’t get lost. **One of the highest number of restaurants per capita in North America** means endless places to explore.

We opened our doors to our first students in 1971 and began welcoming international students in the 1980s.

Credentials & PGWP Eligibility

What you'll graduate with (and why it matters)

Certificates (8 months-1 year) get you job-ready fast in specialized fields.

Diplomas (2-3 years) give you deeper expertise plus that crucial co-op work experience employers love.

Associate degrees (2 years) are brilliant if you want university-level education that transfers.

Bachelor's degrees (4 years) combine degree-level academics with hands-on learning.

Post-degree diplomas (1-2 years) are perfect if you already have a degree but want Canadian experience.

Graduate from Camosun and stay in Canada

Post-Graduation Work Permit

Depending on the program, you may be eligible for a Post-Graduation Work Permit to continue living and working in Canada after completing your studies.

Work integrated learning

Get real work experience while you study

Over 90% of our programs include work experience – co-op, internships, or practicums. You’re working in your field while learning, not just sitting in classrooms.

How it works

Co-op programs alternate between studying and working full-time in the field. You get paid and usually need two work terms for “Co-op Education” designation.

Internships can be full-time or part-time, paid or unpaid. **Practicums** let you shadow professionals and apply classroom skills.

50% of all college co-op placements in BC go to Camosun students. Employers know our students come ready to work.

The support you need

Mandatory Career Development course covers networking, interviews, and job search skills. **International Employment Facilitator** understands what international students face in the Canadian job market.

University Transfer Programs

Start your degree journey with us, finish anywhere you dream

Students come to Camosun thinking they'll eventually transfer to university, but many don't expect to love it here so much. What they find is way better than what they expect.

Arts and Science Studies: Design your path

The Diploma in Arts and Science Studies lets you design your own program. Mix courses from different areas to create exactly what you need. Two years at Camosun can prepare you for further post-secondary studies in a broad range of academic streams.

Associate degrees: The best of both worlds

Associate degrees give you something to show for your two years of study while keeping your transfer options open. You'll graduate with a credential, not just completed courses.

After graduation, you're typically eligible to transfer into third year at universities across B.C. and beyond, depending on your chosen program and meeting university requirements.

How university transfer works

You take university-level courses that cover the same curriculum as first- and second-year university courses, but in classes of 30 instead of 300-500 students. **Over 300 transferable courses** mean you can create any academic foundation you need.

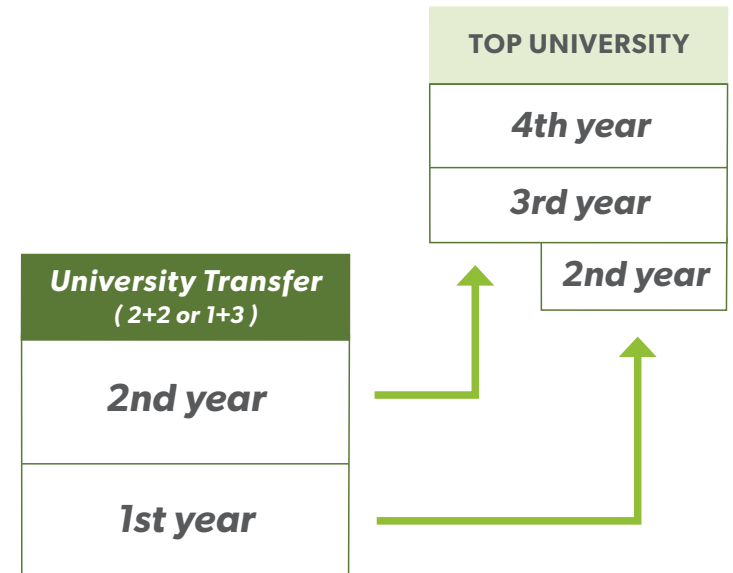
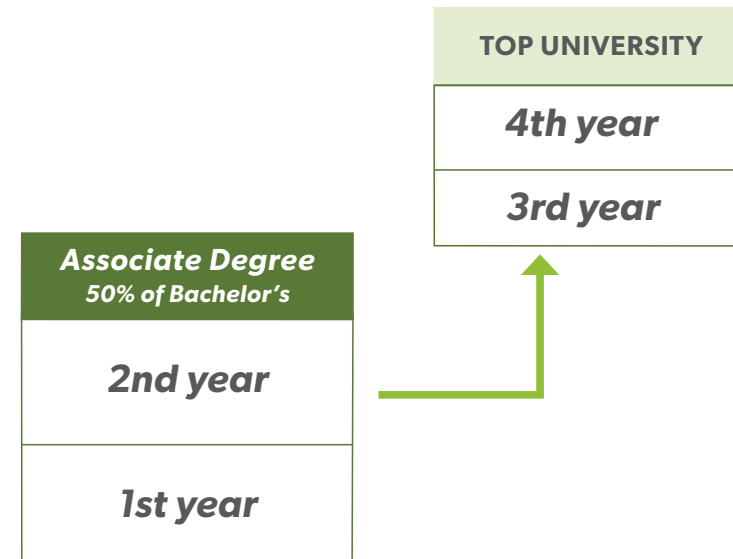
Why this works

Engineer Your Future

Ready to become an engineer? You have two amazing options at Camosun. Start with hands-on technology skills and either bridge to university OR jump straight into the workforce as a technologist. You could also dive straight into university transfer courses. Whatever path you choose, you'll graduate with the practical experience employers want.

Path A: Technology first, then choose your next step

Perfect if you love building things and want practical skills first

Start with real-world engineering technology, then decide: Do you want to work as a technologist right away, or bridge to complete your bachelor's degree at UBC or UVic? The choice is yours!

How it works

Step 1: Complete your Engineering Technology Diploma at Camosun

Start working as an Engineering Technologist **or** Proceed to Step 2

Step 2: Apply for the 8-month to 1-year Bridge program (competitive admission)

Step 3: Transfer to Year 3 at UBC or UVic for your bachelor's degree

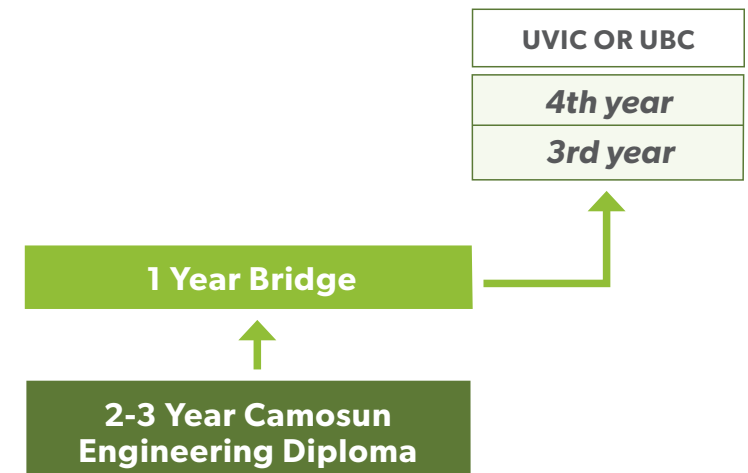
Step 4: Graduate with your bachelor's degree

Path B: Direct university transfer

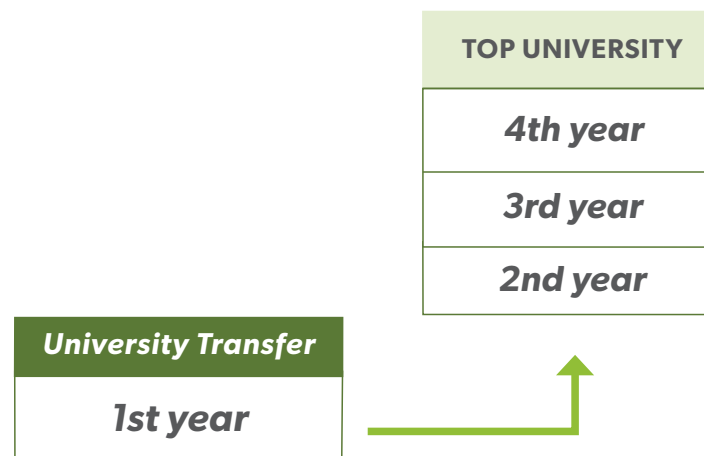
Perfect if you want to focus on engineering theory from day one

Advanced Specialization

Post-Degree Programs

Already have a bachelor's degree? These programs help you change careers or add specialized skills.

Career Change Made Easy

Post-degree diplomas are designed for degree-holders who want to pivot into new fields or gain practical Canadian credentials. HR graduates are prepared for the National Knowledge Exam for **CPHR designation**. Accounting can include **CPA PEP prerequisites** with academic advisor consultation.

Applied Learning Focus

These programs emphasize real-world application with internships, co-ops, and industry projects. You'll graduate with both credentials and Canadian work experience.

Specialized Health Expertise

Athletic & Exercise Therapy is a comprehensive four-year bachelor's degree combining hands-on therapy with sport science. Graduates work with athletes and rehabilitation clinics.

Dental Hygiene degree completion program upgrades your Camosun Dental Hygiene Diploma to a Bachelor of Science in one year through partially online study. Become licensed to own/operate a private dental hygiene business.



Study English, Then Move Up

English Language Development & Academic Upgrading

Many successful international students start with English preparation. Building strong English skills first sets you up for success in your academic program. You'll finish faster with better grades.

To join our ESL program, you need:

- A Camosun College English Language Placement test, *OR*
- An equivalent English test score

If you already have English test scores from within the past two years.

You may need only one semester of ESL if you have:

- IELTS Academic (overall 6.0, no sub-scores less than 5.5)
- TOEFL IBT (overall 78, no sub-scores less than 17)
- Cambridge C1 Advanced (Overall 174, no sub-scores less than 162)
- CAEL CE (overall 60, no sub-score less than 50)
- PTE Academic (overall 54, no sub-score less than 46)

You may need only two semesters of ESL if you have:

- IELTS Academic (overall 5.5, no sub-scores less than 5.0)
- TOEFL IBT (overall 71, no sub-scores less than 16)
- Cambridge C1 Advanced (overall 162, no sub-scores less than 154)
- CAEL CE (overall 50, no sub-score less than 40)
- PTE Academic (overall 46, no sub-score less than 42)

Students with lower English scores or no test scores will start at the appropriate level based on their placement test results.

ESL at Camosun

Our ESL program has 8 levels, and each level lasts one semester. We welcome students at all levels and will place you in the right class for your English skills.

Admissions

Ready to start your Camosun journey? Most programs operate on first-to-apply, first-to-qualify, first-to-be-admitted basis. **Apply early!**

General Admission Requirements

Age Requirements:

- Ages 17-18*: High school graduation mandatory
- Ages 19 or older*: High school graduation highly recommended

**by the start of your first academic term.*

If you are a High School Graduate and 16 years old or younger, please contact International Admissions.

English Proficiency (choose one):

- Camosun ELD 092 and 094, or ELD 097 with grade C or better
- Recognized ESL pathway partner certificate
- BC English 12 or English Studies 12 with grade C+ or better
- IELTS Academic: 6.0 overall (no sub-score less than 6.0)
- TOEFL iBT: 78 overall (no sub-score less than 19)
- PTE Academic: 54 overall (no sub-score less than 50)
- Cambridge (C1): 174 overall (no sub-score less than 169)
- CAEL: 60 overall (no sub-score less than 60)
- Other approved alternatives

How to apply

Ready to join Camosun? Follow these three simple steps to start your application.

STEP 1: Apply online

Submit your application through EducationPlannerBC and pay the non-refundable application fee.

Supporting documents you'll need:

- **Transcripts** (high school/post-secondary) - scanned copies acceptable for application, but official sealed transcripts must be received by Camosun International before classes start
- **Proof of English proficiency**
- **Passport copy** (photo, personal information, and signature pages)
- **Study permit** or other Canadian permits (if applicable)
- **Program-specific documents** (if required)

Documents in other languages need certified English translation.

STEP 2: Receive Letter of Eligibility

We'll review your application and send a Letter of Eligibility if we can offer you a seat. You'll need to pay your tuition and fee deposit to move to the next step.

Tuition and fee deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable. See our [First Semester International Student Refund / Deferral Procedure for details](#).

STEP 3: Receive Letter of Acceptance and Provincial Attestation Letter

After receiving your deposit payment, we'll issue your Letter of Acceptance and obtain your Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) from the B.C. government on your behalf. Once you've received these documents, submit them to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) along with your study permit application.

All PGWP applications are subject to approval by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). Applicants are responsible for meeting all eligibility criteria as determined by IRCC. Camosun College is not responsible for the outcome of PGWP applications and has no authority over the processing or determination of a PGWP application.

In addition to meeting other PGWP requirements, international students in non-degree programs (such as certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees) must complete a program in an eligible field of study, as designated by IRCC. The program must be on the list of eligible fields of study organized by the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) system at the time the applicant submits either the study permit application or the PGWP application, or as otherwise required by IRCC. **IRCC may update the list of eligible fields of study and eligibility criteria for PGWP at any time.** It is the applicant's responsibility to consult the most current information from IRCC.

*** Estimated total costs are in **Canadian dollars** and include tuition, fees and work integrated learning experience, if applicable. Work experience may be in the form of a co-op, internship, clinical placement, or practicum. The estimated tuition depends on a version of the program and course offerings in a particular semester. Tuition is calculated using approved rates for the 2025-2026, 2026-2027, 2027-2028, and 2028-2029 school years (where applicable). Non-instructional fees and student benefits are based on the 2025-2026 school year. Some costs are subject to change at any time.
