REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

If registering for a 4x4: please register and pay for your 4x4 course via the Call Centre at 416-289-5300 (option 2).

If registering for RNED 500: please request registration for RNED 500 via email to osiason@centennialcollege.ca and ensure that you provide your student number. Please read the "Notes on RNED 500" section before requesting to register.

Registration begins Monday, April 25, 2022.

April 25, 2022 – May 10, 2022: Registration open to all students on a first-come, first-served basis.

It is important to note that these courses are very intensive – one day is equivalent to one week of class.

REGISTRATION MATTERS

Course Selection

You are responsible for ensuring that your course choice is part of your program (i.e., your program curriculum).

Course Prerequisites

You are required to fulfill course pre-requisites. In some cases, you may not know if you have the prerequisites until after winter semester grades are available. Should you not have the given course pre-requisite, Centennial reserves the right to cancel your registration and refund fees paid.

Registration

It is highly recommended that you register as soon as possible and at least five (5) days prior to the start of your course to avoid the disappointment of the class being full.

Fees

Payment may be made by VISA, MasterCard, or American Express over the phone.

Withdrawal Procedures

To withdraw officially from your 4x4 or RNED 500 course, you must complete an ADD/DROP form. You are considered officially withdrawn when you submit the completed form to Enrolment Services. You are not officially withdrawn if you cease to attend class, notify your instructor that you intend to withdraw, or provide verbal notice to Enrolment Services staff. If you cease to attend class and do not officially withdraw, you will be assigned an "F" or "FNA" grade.

Withdrawal with Partial Refund of Fees

You must officially withdraw (see procedures above) from your course by the applicable date indicated in the Important Dates section in order to qualify for a partial refund of fees (meaning you will be refunded the course tuition less \$25 for administration charges). Should you decide to withdraw after the refund deadline, you will not be eligible for a refund of fees (e.g., tuition, materials, locker fee, etc.)

Withdrawal without Academic Penalty

You must officially withdraw (see procedures above) from your by the applicable date indicated in the Important Dates section in order to be officially removed from the class list without academic penalty. Should you choose not to attend your class after June 5, you will remain on the class list and be assigned an "F" or "FNA" grade.

Cancellation of Courses

Some courses may be cancelled due to low enrolment. If this happens, your fees will be fully refunded or you may transfer into another summer semester course if space is available. However, the college reserves the right to cancel courses or to change courses, fees, instructors, locations, and hours of instruction where necessary.

Grade Reports

Hard-copy grade reports will not be mailed. Grades are available online at myCentennial (my.centennialcollege.ca). To protect the privacy of students, the Enrolment Services Office will not provide grade information over the phone.

Financial Assistance

Some registrants of 4x4 courses (4-week duration) may be eligible for financial assistance. To be considered for OSAP, 4x4 registrants must:

- Be currently enrolled with 60% or more of the assigned student contact hours in Winter Semester 2022
- Be OSAP-eligible in Winter Semester 2022; and
- Have any Summer 2022 assistance calculated as an extension of their Winter 2022 OSAP allocation.

Registrants who do not meet the above criteria will be ineligible. Please apply before your course begins. Please email studentfinancial@centennialcollege.ca for more information from our Financial Aid Office, if needed.

Note: Registrants in RNED 500 sections in Summer 2022 that do not have a full-time course load for that semester are ineligible for OSAP assistance.

GENERAL EDUCATION ELECTIVES

Principles of Psychology (GNED 129)

This course is designed to introduce the learner to the theoretical and practical discipline of psychology. The goal of the course is to enable learners to view their lives and interactions from a psychological perspective, employing scientific methods and research information. We will explore the following sub-fields of psychology: biology, states of consciousness, learning, memory, motivation, personality, disorders, and treatment. We will view them through the lenses of the major perspectives of psychology: biological, psychodynamic, cognitive, behavioral and humanistic. Improving one's well-being and social interaction will be part of our process, in class. This course will enable you to base your personal and world views more on scientific principles, rather than simple opinion.

Customer Service: A Modern Approach (GNED 160)

This course is designed to help students understand the concept of customer service to both external and internal customers to support their careers and personal growth as service providers. Due to globalization, organizations increasingly require that employees have the knowledge and skills to deliver exemplary service to meet the needs of a diverse clientele. Informed by an understanding of the processes involved in creating customer loyalty, retention and satisfaction, students will be able to utilize verbal and nonverbal communication skills to achieve the highest level of customer satisfaction in a variety of industry settings.

Ethics In Society, Technology and the Environment (GNED 212)

This course provides students with an understanding of the impact of technology on society and the environment. The course examines ethical issues governing social, technological and environmental policies, and the impact of their implementation. Students will learn to analyze, question and resolve ethical dilemmas by developing a personal framework for ethical and moral decision-making. Students will explore their responsibilities in their personal and professional lives, in the community and in the global environment. Examples include: privacy versus law enforcement, access to information, freedom of speech versus control of content, stem cell research and medical advances in the context of culture, global warming, green energies and sustainable technologies.

INDIGENOUS STUDIES SPECIALIZED ACADEMIC CERTIFICATE

First Peoples' Stories: Self-governance and Sovereignty (GNED 412 – formerly known as GNED 252)

This course will allow students to explore themes of self-governance and sovereignty, building on previous First Peoples Studies courses on current issues (GNED 410) and community (GNED 411). Through stories of reclamation, advocacy, and agency, students will examine the evolving perspectives on self-governance and self-determination.

Prerequisite: GNED 410 (or GNED 250) and GNED 411 (or GNED 251)

GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP AND EQUITY – CORE CONCEPTS

Core Concepts In Global Citizenship and Equity (RNED 500)

This is a remedial course for students who persisted in GNED 500 and were unsuccessful in obtaining the credit. The course will emphasize core concepts in the study of equity and social justice, focusing on topics of global citizenship, social analysis, critical media literacy, identity, equality, equity and inequality, and social action. The students will be engaged in interactive group-based learning which will be reinforced by individual assignments.

Prerequisite: “F” grade or higher in GNED 500

Note: Students also wishing to improve on the grade previously earned in GNED 500 may also take this class.

Notes on RNED 500:

- Rationale for registering for RNED 500 as opposed to 4x4 section:
 - reduced time commitment (18 hours vs. 42 hours);
 - reduced cost; and
 - smaller section sizes allow for greater individual student focus.
- There is a mandatory attendance policy for the RNED 500 course. Students that miss more than one session of RNED 500 will be unsuccessful in obtaining a credit and will be assigned a failing grade.
- Students that have previously obtained a grade of “FNA” or had dropped GNED 500 without academic penalty are **not** permitted to enroll into a section of RNED 500.
- Unless a student has a “full-time” course load for the Summer 2022 semester and has received OSAP funding in Winter 2022, registration in RNED 500 for Summer 2022 **is not eligible for OSAP funding** and students will have to pay up-front to register.
- Registration for students in RNED 500 may change student status from part-time to full-time (contingent upon total enrolment hours).
- International students taking RNED 500 as a final course for their studies at Centennial College are eligible to have their student visas extended to cover the duration of the course. Please contact International Education for more details.



GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP AND EQUITY

Global Citizenship: from Social Analysis to Social Action (GNED 500)

Global citizenship provides students with an opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills required to live and work in a world that is globally interconnected. Students will examine and critically analyze social problems, gain an understanding of identity and values, develop an awareness of media conglomeration, power and control, and investigate issues of equality and equity using different perspectives to develop a plan for social action that will bring about positive change. This course allows students to develop a sound understanding of what it means to be a global citizen, both personally and professionally, and the ways in which they can make a contribution to an equitable society and world.
