APPLIED RESEARCH	Research projects carried out by students and faculty experts.			
CAPSTONE PROJECT	A multi-faceted assignment that challenges students to apply all of the knowledge and skills they've acquired throughout their studies.

Getting to DC by car is easily accessible by major highways. To get to our Oshawa campus, take the Simcoe Street exit off Highway 407 and go south, or take the Simcoe Street exit off Highway 401 and travel north. Our Whitby campus is conveniently located just off the 401 at the Thickson Road exit in Whitby.

OPTIONS TO FIT YOUR NEEDS

CERTIFICATES (ONE YEAR)

These two- and three-semester programs allow graduates to seek employment in their field of study or continue their education into a diploma, advanced diploma or degree program.

DIPLOMAS (TWO YEARS)

Through four semesters of study, students will be prepared for the workforce or further study in a graduate certificate or degree program. Some programs have a work term at the end of first or second year.

ADVANCED DIPLOMAS (THREE YEARS)

These six-semester programs offer specialized training that prepares students for the workforce or further study in a graduate certificate or degree program. Some programs have a work term at the end of first or second year.

BACHELOR DEGREE (THREE YEARS)

A seven-semester paralegal degree is the first of its kind offered in Ontario creating pathways for students to be a licensed paralegal or transfer to an honours program.

HONOURS BACHELOR DEGREES (FOUR YEARS)

Eight- and nine-semester honours degree programs offer a solid foundation of theoretical knowledge and hands-on, practical skills that can be applied in the real world.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATES (ONE YEAR)

These two- and three-semester programs require a university or college credential and/or specific experience for admission, and provide students the opportunity to deepen their knowledge and further hone their skills to expand their career opportunities.

FLEXIBLE LEARNING

DC offers online learning, hybrid and flexible learning options, with some programs providing students the choice of attending in person or online.



It's also home to the summer farmer's market and community-supported agriculture program. An on-site composting facility with a biodigester processes food lab and field waste making our site field-to-fork-to-field.

A hydroponic vertical farm, built inside a 40-foot repurposed shipping container, is just one of the innovative additions to the farm, allowing the Centre to grow up to 700 heads of lettuce a week, all year round. We also feature aquaponics, grow walls and microgreen production, a pollinator garden, an apiary and more.



In the Mobile Crane Simulator Lab, students begin to understand the types and configurations of cranes and the science upon which they operate. The Motor Vehicle Shop is equipped with vehicles for students to learn disassembly/re-assembly procedures and troubleshooting techniques. The campus also boasts shops for carpentry, welding, millwright and power engineering, and the newly opened Vanhaverbeke Family EV Training Centre. Students at DC receive the best experiential learning opportunities to succeed in the skilled trades in Ontario and beyond.

STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITIES

Located at the Whitby campus, the 60,000-square-foot Ontario Power Generation Centre for Skilled Trades and Technology (CSTT) is home to many specialized labs and shops that support student learning across numerous full-time post-secondary and apprenticeship programs.

The facility opened its doors in 2021 and includes a shop lab and twostorey building model, which allows plumbing and elevating devices students to work simultaneously within, above and below an easily accessible dual-level elevator shaft.





DURHAM COLLEGE LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT
