What is Secularism?

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• Secularism refers to this separation of religion from the State.

- Example of discrimination
- Israel- treats its own Muslims badly.
- Saudi- non Muslims cant build temple or gather in public prayers.
- Discrimination happens when one religion was given an official recognition by the Gov.




Why it is important to separate religion from the state?

> 1 Reasons

- Religion should be separated from the state.
- If any religion with majority got an official place then it can easily violate or kill a minor religions rights.







> 2 Reason

A particular individuals has the right to practice its or any other religion or have the freedom to interpret religious preachings.

> Example


If a particular group does not like untouchables and has the official recogn. Of the state, then no other individual can stop them from doing that as they have the power of the state.



What is Indian secularism?

- One religion community does not dominate another.
- State does not take away their religious freedom of individuals.
- In India gov.t spaces like courts, schools, offices doesn't promote or display any religion.





India with different secular strategy

> 1 strategy

- In India the state does not support any religion along with use distancing(doesn't display or promote)
- In India (gov.t schools) doesn't display or promote any religion nor in their morning prayers.

Anyway we were planning to celebrate it in our locality.


2 strategy

> 3 strategy


Prevent dominationabolish untouchability

In this strategy the state is intervening in the religion in order to end a dominating social practice.



> 4 strategy

- Indian secularism grants religion to set up their own schools and colleges(financial aids)
- Indian(state) can intervene in religions but with ideals laid in constitution.

Question 1.

Question 2.

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Question 3.

Question 4.
