
Water and the People of Chennai:

A villager of mahbubnagar wrote a letter to court, textile industries are making ground water into chemical poison(court sanction 25 liters of water to each person there.



The Government's Role:


- Only Gov. should provide facilities to the people as other private companies will only give interest for profit.

Water supply to Chennai: is it Available to All:


- Everyone should have facilities but in reality half of the people doesn't get water.

- Water supply work should be also given to private companies rather than Gov. and municipal.










- In may cases private companies was handed over with water supplies but later there was a rise in price.
