MY LAND

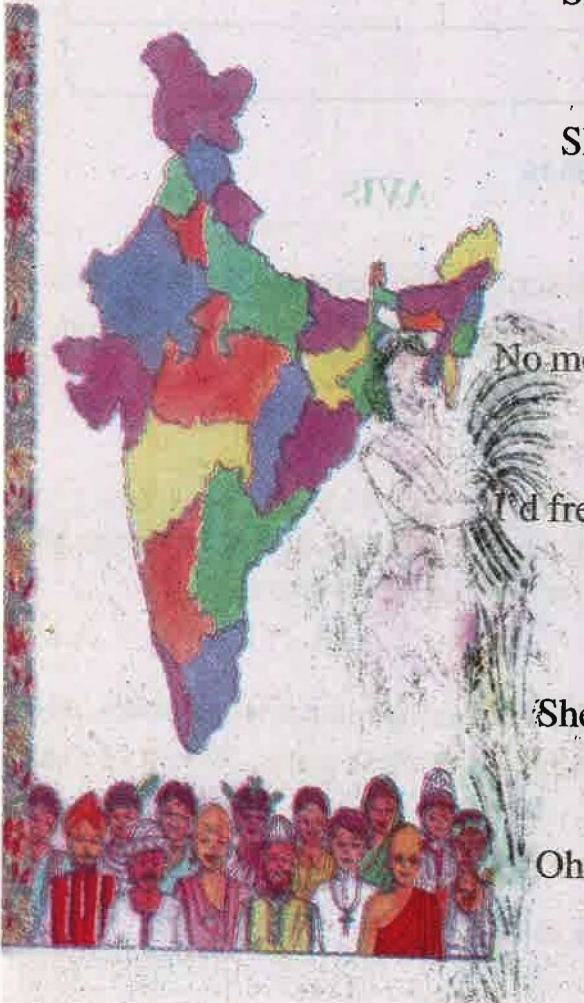
A. WARMER
